## ☐ Education Programs

- ✓ <u>Family to Family Education Course</u> NAMI Family-to-Family is a class for families, caretakers and friends of individuals with mental illness. The course is designed to facilitate a better understanding of mental illness, increase coping skills and empower participants to become advocates for their family members.
- ✓ <u>NAMI Introductions</u> An overview of NAMI services and programs, general information on mental illness, and opportunity for support and questions. Program is for family members, caregivers and individuals managing symptoms.
- ✓ Ending the Silence Helping middle school and high schoolers understand mental illness makes a big difference. Through this free classroom presentation, students get to see the reality of living with a mental health condition. During the 50-minute presentation, a young adult living with mental illness and a family member tell their stories about mental health challenges, including what hurt and what helped.
- ✓ QPR Suicide Prevention Training QPR is a program to teach others how to Question, Persuade, and Refer someone who is suicidal. With the skills learned in this class you will be able to identify common causes of suicidal behavior and warning signs of suicide.
- ✓ Intern and Practicum Student Programs NAMI Lexington boasts a robust intern and student program providing valuable learning experiences for future mental health workers and peers. We devote time and resources to proving students and interns from various colleges around the state in programs like nursing, social work, psychology and law, at associates, bachelor, and master level.

## ☐ Support Programs

- ✓ <u>Multicultural Action Committee (MAC)</u> Diverse communities face many barriers such as higher levels of stigma, misinformation about mental health and language that prevent them from receiving care. Even when they are able to access treatment, these communities often receive poorer quality care due to lack of cultural competence, bias and inadequate resources. This results in misdiagnosis, dropping out of treatment and a longer time to achieve recovery. MAC promotes recovery across diverse populations by advocating, enhancing relationships and educating interested community members.
- ✓ NAMI Connections Support Group NAMI Connection is a weekly recovery support group for people living with mental illness in which people learn from each other's experiences, share coping strategies, and offer each other encouragement and understanding.

- ✓ <u>Family Support Group</u> offers support to family members, caregivers and loved ones of individuals with mental illness.
- ✓ <u>The Warmline</u> A Peer operated non-emergency phone line primarily staffed by Adult Peer Support Specialists provided for anyone who "just needs someone to talk to". The Warmline not only provides peer support for individuals but is a wonderful opportunity for peers to hone their communication and support skills.
- ✓ <u>Double Trouble in Recovery (DTR)</u> Peer led Support Groups for individuals with cooccurring addiction and mental health disorders.

## ☐ Recovery Programs

- ✓ Participation Station Consumer Operated Services (A Peer-operated Center) Participation
  Station is peer run and peer driven. Educational tracks are designed and presented by peers
  5 days a week. Participation Station is free and based on the recovery model providing
  education, outreach and support, and advocacy training to individuals in recovery with a
  serious mental illness. The model of meeting people where they are and providing peer
  support in a non-judgmental atmosphere is working miracles with the program participants.
- ✓ <u>Eastern State Hospital Peer Program</u> We offer groups in the hospital's Recovery Mall, on the units, and at the Central Kentucky Recovery Center. We have facilitated a Consumer Council at the hospital and assist families and loved ones who come for visitation. Services also include orientation for staff and formal and informal peer support. The ESH Peer team is a phenomenally dedicated team that offers services 7 days a week.
- ✓ <u>In Our Own Voice</u> An informational outreach program on recovery presented by trained consumers to other consumers, families, students, professionals, and all people wanting to learn about mental illness. NAMI Lexington provides IOOV to inpatient and outpatient program participants, college students, civic organizations, and groups of community leaders.
- ✓ Fayette County Mental Health Court The mission of Mental Health Court is to protect public safety and reduce the recidivism rate of offenders with mental illness by increasing their wellness. Using an integrated approach involving court supervision, mental health treatment services, peer support, education, employment, and personal accountability, the Mental Health Court seeks positive and long-lasting changes. We currently have 26 clients with 12 graduating Mental Health Court since program inception.
- ✓ <u>WRAP (Wellness Recovery Action Plan) Trainings and Workshops Identify upsetting events, early warning signs and signs that things have gotten much worse and, using Wellness Tools, develop action plans for responding at these times.

<u>IOOV</u> - (In Our Own Voice) An informational outreach program on recovery presented by trained
consumers to other consumers, families, students, professionals, and all people wanting to learn
